INTRODUCTION

You may have heard the word **church** in your life. Perhaps you considered it to be the building where you attended services; but it is much more than that. The word “church” comes from the Greek *ekklesia*, which means “called out.” It is the mystical body of Christ of which He is the head (***Ephesians 1:22-23***). God has called us out of this present world of darkness into a glorious relationship with Him and with other believers who have become our brothers and sisters in the Lord. The true church of Jesus Christ is a spiritual building made up of believers whose bodies have become the holy habitation of God (***Ephesians 2:21-22; I Corinthians 3:9***).

EARLY CHURCH MEETINGS

The "church" of the Old Testament came together for worshiping and edification in the man-made tent known as the tabernacle and later in the temple and other buildings known as synagogues. The New Testament "church," however, had no designated buildings for the first three centuries. And it was in these first three centuries that it experienced its most rapid growth. It often met in halls for teachings and celebrations, but the life of the church was nurtured in their homes.

1. **To make disciples...***discipleship is a process by demonstration.*
2. **To develop a prayer life...***prayer is used continually to help the cell.*
3. **For fellowship...***a productive, positive caring and sharing takes place.*
4. **To manifest the gifts...***saints are given opportunity to minister through the Spirit.*
5. **To allow everyone to minister...***everyone can edify.*
6. **A greater measure of needs are met...***90% of personal needs are provided through HFG.*
7. **Souls can be saved daily...***church only happens on special days...HFG can occur everyday.*
8. **To evangelize...***HFG puts its emphasis upon reaching others.*

It is important to be involved in church activities. We should gather in the sanctuary for corporate worship, to hear the Word preached by the pastor, and to be strengthened by prayer.
